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South Carolina's Employment Situation September 2021

I. Household Survey¹

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,307,087.

- That is an increase of 4,167 people over the August 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 14,569 people over the September 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 98,170 people.

- That is a decrease of 3,311 people from the August 2021 estimate and a significant decrease of 32,230 over the September 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 4.1 percent in September from 4.2 percent in August.

Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased to 4.8 percent in September from 5.2 percent in August.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,405,257.

- That is an increase of 856 people over the August 2021 estimate.
- That is a decrease of 17,661 individuals over the September 2020 estimate.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted³)

The Current Employment Survey² of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 4,700 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,147,500.

- Industries that reported gains were in the Leisure and Hospitality (+3,400); Education and Health Services (+2,100); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+1,800); Other Services (+1,200); and Financial Activities (+400).
- Decreases were observed in the Manufacturing (-1,600); Professional and Business Services (-1,500); Government (-700); Construction (-300); and Information (-100) industries.

From September 2020 to September 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 66,800 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (+25,100); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+14,800); Education and Health Services (+8,300); Construction (+7,600); Government (+5,700); Manufacturing (+3,700); Other Services (+3,600); and Information (+400).
- Declines were noticed in the Financial Activities (-1,900) and Professional and Business Services (-500) industries.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted⁴)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment climbed 3,500 from August 2021 to September 2021 for a total of 2,145,500.

- Increases were reported in Government (+12,100); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2,200); Education and Health Services (+2,100); and Other Services (1,100) industries.
- Decreases were reported in the Leisure and Hospitality (-8,200); Construction (-1,900); Professional and Business Services (-1,800); Manufacturing (-1,600); and Information (-500) industries.
- Mining and Logging and Financial Activities industries remained flat.

Since September 2020, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 67,900 overall in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Leisure and Hospitality (+24,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+17,600); Education and Health Services (+7,800); Government (+5,900); Construction (+5,300); Manufacturing (+4,800); Other Services (+4,500); and Information (+200).
- Declines were noticed in the Financial Activities (-1,300) and Professional and Business Services (-900) industries.
- Mining and Logging Industry remained flat.

¹Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

²Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

³Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

⁴Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
